

**PORT CLINTON CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING**

The regular meeting of the Port Clinton City Council was held at the Port Clinton City Hall with Linda Hartlaub, President of Council, presiding. The meeting opened at 7:30pm. Council recited the Pledge of Allegiance, The Lord's Prayer, and a moment of silence for those serving our Country.

The role was called and the following Council members were present: Mike Snider, Gabe Below, Jerry Tarolli, Nicole DeFreitas and Margaret Phillips. Lisa Sarty was excused from this meeting.

The Chair noted the certification has been received regarding the compliance with the rules and notification of this meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Jane Storrs, 111 Alma Street, asked for some information from the City and CORD. She states she received the information from the city, but not CORD and wondered when she would be receiving it. She notes there is nothing on file with the Attorney General regarding their organization and asked where that could be found. She also asked for a copy of the referendum that will be voted on. She was informed it is on file in the Auditor's Office. A copy was received today regarding the final language that will be voted on. She also asked who the CORD Officers were. She was asked to ask that outside the Council meeting.

Jerry Jonke, 117 Cedar Street, asked for information regarding the lighthouse lease. The Mayor has reviewed the contract and the placement has been established. They are waiting on the sub land lease between the city and Coastal Management.

Rick Noderer, 608 E. Perry Street, stated that Port Clinton events applications are not leases. Mr. Noderer stated the park protection initiative will not be affected and hopes statements will not confuse or block the initiative. They are striving for the betterment of the community.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor stated that the subcommittee for the Ohio Public Works Commission is moving forward. 2 out of the 11 are passed now. They will meet on September 24, 2014 at the Court House. ODOT district Deputy Director helped the city move forward with the Madison Street Grant.

The Beacon has presented the Best of the Best and they are in a few categories. The Ceremony will take place on September 18, 2014 from 5-8pm at Mon Ami.

The Mayor has received several complaints from the Water Office and they have reviewed video. Mayor noted that the actions of some of the community members are disturbing and whether groups agree with each other or not, everyone still needs to be civil.
