

ORDINANCE 10-17

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE  
DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND SERVICE TO PREPARE AND  
SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO  
DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SMALL CITIES FUND  
PROGRAM(S) AND TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) operates a Small Cities fund program to provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure, and

Whereas, the City of Port Clinton is planning to make capital improvements to Fulton Street/Second Street from the intersection of the east-west alley between Fifth and Sixth Street southerly to the south line of the south entrance to the Magruder Hospital and to Second Street from its intersection with Jefferson Street to its intersection with the west right of way line of Adams Street ( "Project 1"), and improvements to Jefferson Street from the intersection of Perry Street to the intersection of East Third Street ( Project 2), and

Whereas, the infrastructure improvement herein above described are considered to be priority needs for the community and are qualified projects under the ODOT Small Cities program,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Council of the City of Port Clinton, Ottawa County, Ohio:

Section 1. The Director of Safety and Service is hereby authorized and directed to apply to the ODOT Small Cities program for funds for the above described Projects.

Section 2. The Director of Safety and Service is further authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining this financial assistance.

Section 3. The local funds needed for this Project are hereby appropriated from the Municipal Purposes Fund.

Section 4. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committee that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 5. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the City and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order for the City to be able to submit an application for the ODOT funding of the project in its current round of funding, and to meet the deadline for filing the funding application; Wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
