

ORDINANCE NO. 4-17

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE
DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND SERVICE TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND ENTER
INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT OF
MADISON STREET, FROM EAST 3RD STREET THRU PERRY STREET/NORTH
MADISON AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

Whereas, a portion of the public street known as Madison Street is in need of improvement, repair, and replacement, and

Whereas, the City has prepared plans and specifications for the street improvements which include, among other improvements, installation of a storm water pump station, removing and replacing pavement, providing for necessary drainage improvements, installation of electrical conduit, sidewalk and curb replacement, and associated structures and appurtenances; and

Whereas, the City had previously applied for, received and accepted from the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC), the Ohio Department of Transportation Small Cities Program, the Ottawa County Revolving Loan Fund, and the Community Development Block Grant Fund, financial assistance to assist with the Madison Street Reconstruction Project (the "Project"), along with Main Thoroughfare Funds; and

Whereas, this Council finds and determines that the City should proceed with this Project at the earliest possible time.

Now, therefore, be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Port Clinton, Ottawa County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Director of Safety and Service is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contracts for the reconstruction of Madison Street from East 3rd Street thru Perry Street/North Madison, all in accordance with the Project plans and specifications on file in his office.

Section 2. That the funds necessary to complete the Project are hereby appropriated from the Municipal Purposes Fund and the Madison Street Reconstruction Fund.

Section 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its Committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or Committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 4. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for the further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order to allow the City to

advertise for bids for this project for construction with a mandatory bid opening date of no later than April 1, 2017 as established by ODOT in order to take advantage of the grant/loan funding received for this Project, and so that the Project will be completed at the required time.

Wherefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
