The regular meeting of the Port Clinton City Council held in the Linda Hartlaub City Hall Chambers. Lisa Sarty, President of Council, presided and the meeting opened at 6:00 p.m.

MAYOR'S REPORT

At the last Council meeting Anthony Hatmaker, Ottawa County Treasurer, presented information regarding the school districts / 20-mill floor. Mayor Snider has been notified that the County Commissioners did take action to reduce property taxes throughout the county.

Yesterday the Administration was informed that Water Works Parks has been awarded the designation of "Lake Erie Scenic Vista". Very few locations have this designation. It is a nine-step process by Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), that they did on their own accord. Signage has been provided and will be placed in the spring of 2025.

Saturday, December 14, 2024, 11:00, the Wreaths Across America ceremony will take place at Riverview Cemetery (end of W. Third Street). After the ceremony, wreaths will be placed at all the Veterans laid to rest at Riverview and Lakeview Cemetery.

Lindsay Kaufman (former Port Clinton resident) currently lives in the Dominican Republic and started a non-profit, Strength for the Journey. From time to time, she brings residents from the Dominican Republic to Port Clinton to visit with government officials. This past summer Ms. Kaufman brought Mayor Jairo Morillo Arvelo. During their visit they toured Port Clinton's Fire Department; they are in the beginning stages of forming a fire department in their community. In fire service industry all the turn out gear that fireman wear is governed how long it can be used in the United States (has an expiration date). When expired it has been donated to other countries that don't have these policies. Port Clinton Fire Department donated helmets, pants, jackets, air packs, wrench, tools, etc. that can no longer be used in the day-to-day operations to Mayor Arvelo to utilize for his community. Ms. Kaufman and Mayor Arvelo were here last week to assist in packing all the donated equipment. During their visit Mayor Arvelo presented Mayor Snider with the Key to his City. He also presented Interim Fire Chief Brian Gutman an official proclamation appointing him the unofficial Fire Chief of their community.

Santa Claus has arrived!!! His available hours to stop by are Wednesday, December 11th & 18th from 5:00 – 6:00pm and Sunday, December 15th & 22nd from 12:00 – 1:00 pm, at Adams Street Park.

John & Donna McElwee former second homeowners in the city (for 25 years), recently sold their home and came across some Port Clinton Christmas ornaments that she donated to the city. They are displayed on the Christmas Tree located at Port Clinton City Hall / Water Department.

After this evening's Council meeting, Mayor Snider will be conducting a presentation on Community Support Groups at the Economic Community Development Committee meeting.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Ordinance 21-24, temporary appropriations to allow the city to cover necessary expenditures for January and February of 2025. The goal is to enact a full budget by the beginning of March. Due to the proposed lower attendance of Council members at the next Council meeting, requesting Council to consider adopting this evening.

Ordinance 23-24, follow up on the recreation amenities plan. The \$49,500 is the remaining American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds that are to be obligated by the end of 2024. This allows the city to do survey / site prep work at Water Works Park, Phase 1 recreation improvement (splash pad). Requested that Council consider adopting this evening due to time constraints.

Ordinance 24-24 & Ordinance 25-24, this is bookkeeping for the State Auditors.

- Ordinance 24-24 establishes an IRA forestry grant fund. This is a reimbursement grant the city was awarded. The city must have a separate fund to manage the funds.
- Ordinance 25-24, USDA street improvement funds for the road work that has already been completed. The City will start payment on this right away.
- Ordinance 26-24, Increasing amount limits of blanket purchase orders. The State Auditor made the city aware that Council had not approved a blanket purchase order amount limit and is required to do so.

Mr. Morgan inquired was there a reason we couldn't have received the new ordinances prior to allow for three readings?

Mr. Below advised Ordinance 24-24 & Ordinance 25-24 was not brought to his attention until just recently. Ordinance 23-24, that was just finalized last month.

Ordinance 22-24, ODOT requires this ordinance for the revetment work at W. Lakeshore Drive.

Mr. Colston advised that the city needs to determine if they will extend the current garbage / recycling contract with Republic Services (for one additional year by December 31, 2024) or open it up bids for garbage pickup alone and garbage pickup to include recycling.

Discussion ensued for and against going out for bid.

Mr. Tarolli moved to authorize the Safety Service Director to send out letters requesting bids for trash collection; seconded by Ms. Hovis.

Those that apply for the waiver have an application process that they have to meet certain criteria to be approved.

Ms. Hovis moved to authorize an additional \$10,000 to be added to the H2O program for the balance of 2024 and 2025; seconded by Ms. Phillips.
